The past year can be summed up pretty well with one word: GROWTH!

It's been an exciting time at bike. Between July 2009 and June 2010 of 2009, we met 194 new members. up from 86 in 2008!

Revenues from sales reflected this growth: new part sales grossed \$3,776.18 while used part sales brought in \$3600.88. This income has enabled B!KE to continue to expand our tool collection, as this year saw the purchase of a variety of specialized tools that increase the usability of the
