This year 77 volunteers gave their time to B!KE. 26 of those volunteers are returning and 51 were new! We estimate that they gave 1476 hours of service to B!KE. Thanks you for all your hard work making this year such a huge success!

Program Highlights

OPEN SHOP

The Open Shop program ran four nights a week througout 2014, for at total of 22 hours per week during the cycling season and 16 hours per week in the off-season. The 2014 year of operation saw a 35% growth in users over 2013 with 2318 distinct uses! Of these uses, 247 were made by youth, which is a 27% growth in youth users specifically. The community provided a variety of support for this programming, including both cash and in-kind donations. A total of 172 bikes were donated for used in Open Shop!

SCHOOL PROGRAMMING

YOUTH EARN-A-BIKE

B!KE and GreenUp partnered to offer programming in 12 schools to a total of over 850 youth! Programs ranged from single day events such as bike rodeos and maintenance workshops, to weekly skill building programs such as Pedal Power. In 2015 we hope to continue to grow our in-class programming with the support of the Trillium Foundation, the City of Peterborough, and the Canadian Tire Jumpstart Foundation.

Three sessions of Youth Earn-A-Bike have already been completed and a fourth is now underway. The first three-sessions had a 100% completion rate! Sixteen youth have completed the program to date, and five are currently enrolled. Partnership with PACE allows this program to be delivered during class time as a for-credit program and Trillium Foundation funding allows for the program to be offered in the community at large. B!KE's plans to launch an Adult Earn-A-Bike program in the spring of 2015.

B!KE @ TRENT

We offered 33 days of Open Shop on campus, and 60 students and faculty made use of this program. 10 volunteers helped make it happen by contributing 105 hours of service. New signboards on bike racks will be used to promote spring and summer programming.

BIKE LIBRARY

Our bicycle Library Program saw no growth in membership during the 2014 year of operation despite incresed promotion and outreach. Due to high resource demand and low program impact B!KE will no longer be offering this program to the general public in 2015. Many partner organizations have expressed an interest in providing access to bicycles for their staff or members, and we will be offering our fleet to partners for use in a modified library structure.
